
It is my honor and privilege, not only to say that I am happy to be your pastor, but that we are now part of




We will also be working on putting past issues of the *Beacon* online as well as resources become available.

Bright yellow school buses are parked in bus barns and the kids are home eagerly enjoying summer vacation. But, it won't be long until the kids will be back in those school buses and in need of brand new school supplies for the 2023-2024 school year.

Starting mid-June into the month of July, our little school bus will once again be parked in the church narthex. You can slip your generous monetary gifts thru the door of the bus and one of the little people inside the bus will happily accept your gift to Reelfoot Rural Ministries. Also, a list of the needed school supplies is parked next to the school bus. If you enjoy shopping and would prefer to purchase the needed school supplies take a copy of the list with you. Our Church Librarian and several volunteers have succeeded in putting nearly all of our church library books into our new digital catalog. This new digital catalog ("Tiny Cat") is now available on the church's website at www.malesusumc.org. While we still need to confirm that all of our books are listed in this new catalog, attention is being turned to properly cataloging all those books so that it is relatively easy to search for books that may interest someone. This cataloging of books is often known as "tagging". A list of tags is displayed on the home page of our digital catalog.

Although we have a long way to go to finish this process, one of the tags is called "Group study". By clicking on the "Group study" tag, you will get a list of the 124 books (with more still being added) with this specific tag.

These books include, but are not limited to: When Christ Lives in Us; The Ten Commandments from the Back Side; The Gospel of John: Finding Identify and Purpose; Real Faith for Real Life: Living the Six Marks of Discipleship; and many others. Many of these books also include a DVD.

All groups, both inside and outside our church family, are encouraged to peruse these books to increase your faith and becoming better disciples.

We are still working out an easy-to-use system to check out our books and other reference materials. There's still a bunch of work to do to make it happen. However, whenever returning a book to the library please do NOT put the book back on the shelves but simply place the book in the fabric box marked for the return of library materials. We hope to announce this new system in the next several months. In the meantime, you can contact our Church Librarian, Jane Steel, with any questions.

# **An Abundance of Gifts**

In 2022, people set some amazing Guinness World Records. A Nebraska man paddled more than 37 miles in a hollowed-out pumpkin boat. A Vermont teen wearing 4-inch heels walked more than 600 feet across a tightrope. And an Oregon man found and alphabetized all 26 letters in a can of alphabet soup in 2 minutes and 8.6 seconds. (The toughest part, he says, is distinguishing subtle differences between letters such as M and W.)

Your talents might not earn you any world records, but they certainly can grow faith and change lives. Whether you're good at teaching, singing, writing, cooking or accounting, the church can put those skills to productive use. Romans 12 lists many more qualities you may not realize are spiritual gifts: graciousness, serving, generosity, acts of mercy, loving and honoring others, extending hospitality, rejoicing and weeping with people, making peace.

You might not be able to outperform the alphabet soup record. But God abundantly blesses each of us to "outdo one another in showing honor" (Romans 12:10, ESV) and in sharing his love.

KIVA is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that enables anyone and everyone to loan money via the Internet to low-income entrepreneurs and students in 77 countries. KIVA uses crowd-funded micro-loans as a force for good, creating a space where people can have one-to-one impacts, and together, expand financial access in under-developed countries around the world.



Our 8th and latest loan recipient is Fanantenana from Madagascar. Fanantenana is 34 years old, married and has three children. She lives in a small rural village with her family. She is enterprising, earning a living farming and raising animals. She is proud of being able to contribute to making money for her household. Her spouse works as a driver.

With a previous loan she invested in her potato crops and she bought a pig with her profits. She also put some cash into savings as the family plans to construct a suitable house.

Fanantenana requested this loan to buy a cow, 2 more pigs and feed for the animals. She will keep the cow. The pigs will be fattened and sent to the butcher. She hopes to again make good profits to add to her savings for the future family home.



# God's Got You

In Roman 4 Paul writes: "If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ... For this reason the promise depends on faith, in order that it may rest on grace" (v. 14, 16, NRSV). Here and elsewhere, Paul firmly explains that we are saved through God's grace, or unconditional love, made known most profoundly in Jesus Christ. But this passage raises a question: If belief (trust, faith) reckons us as righteous before God, what if we don't trust, can't believe, have lost all faith?

Pastor Martin Luther (1483-1546) assures us that even this is a gift of God: "I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead the Holy Spirit has called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, made me holy and kept me in the true faith" (The Small Catechism; emphasis added). Later in Romans, Paul declares that when we feel so lost (unbelieving, lacking in faith) that we don't even know how to pray, the "Spirit himself intercedes for us" (8:26, NIV). Rest assured, dear one: God's got you. —Heidi Hyland Mann
