

involved in many of the wonderful ministries taking place at Malesus. I have been encouraged and excited to share in these ministry opportunities.

I want to highlight some of these next step ministry opportunities where you can get involved. During our first week here, I had someone approach me before worship service, and said I want to pray for you before service.

On Tuesday of the first week, I met with a group of men at Jack's to have prayer. Bacon, egg, and biscuits are pretty good, too. On Thursday I met with another group for prayer. There are 650 prayers mentioned in the Bible. Approximately 450 of them are answers to prayer. The Bible records Jesus praying 25 different times during his early ministry. Praying can be done anywhere and in any posture. The Bible does list five specific postures: Sitting, standing, kneeling, face to the ground, and with hands lifted up.

There are different kinds of prayers in the Bible: Prayer of faith, prayer of agreement, prayer of petition and supplication, prayer of thanksgiving, prayer of worship, prayers of consecration, prayers of intercession, prayers for justice, and praying in the Spirit. I encourage you to research these different prayers.

The Book of Acts Chapter 4 verses 29-30 records a prayer of the first century Church. It is interesting what they pray for. I hope you will read what they prayed for. Do we need to pray this prayer?

As followers of Christ in the twenty-first century, we can learn to pray this kind of prayer. God granted them an answer. I feel if we pray for what they prayed for, God will also answer us today!

I want to invite you to attend on Tuesday's at 8am at Jack's in south Jackson. You can attend on Thursday's at 8am in the library at Malesus United Methodist Church. If you cannot attend either of these opportunities, maybe God would lead you to start an additional opportunity to gather and pray. Let's keep praying!!!

Take away my difficulties, that victory over them may bear witness to those I would help of thy power, thy love and thy way of life. May I do thy will always!




DISASTER RELIEF FOR MAUI



Published in 2022, **Joy Marie Clarkson** is a doctoral candidate at the Institute for Theology, Imagination, and the Arts at Scotland's ancient University of

St. Andrews, where she teaches courses in theology and ethics. She hosts the *Speaking with Joy* podcast, which offers an arsenal of good stories, music, and imagery. She writes regularly for publications such as *Christianity Today*, *Plough*, and the *American Bible Society*. She has co-authored one book, *Girl's Club with Sally and Sarah Clarkson*, and wrote the *Girl's Club Experience*, a small group guide based on the trade book.

Joy says: "This world can be exhausting, despairing, and cynical. But you don't have to be. Instead, you can unlock the power to a happy life--an act of defiance that will make you more resilient in times of turmoil, pain, and chaos. Cultivating happiness takes grit, determination, and a good sense of humor. It's not always easy, but it's well worth it."

Joy Marie Clarkson leads the way, crafting an audacious case for happiness no matter what you're going through. With her signature humor and lyrical storytelling, Joy offers an irresistible invitation: "If we accept that life will be full of difficulties and sorrows, we then have two options: to resign ourselves to life generally being a bummer, or to seek enjoyment, delight, and hope in the midst of (and in spite of!) life's up and downs. To put it bluntly: You could choose to cultivate happiness, or you could not - I think we should go for it."
